

## English

This half term in English, we will be reading the book 'Who Let the Gods Out?' by Maz Evans. We will also be reading different Greek myths and legends. We will be creating our own myth, focussing on including a hero, creature and message or meaning behind the story.

## Maths

This half term we will continue looking at fractions, and finding decimal and percentage equivalents. We will then move into finding the perimeter and area of different shapes.

## Computing

Our topic in computing this term will be Databases. We will be learning how to use databases to search for information and will also create our own database using information gathered as a class.

## RE

This term we will be exploring the question 'What would Jesus do?' Through this, we will be looking at Christianity and considering why Jesus was inspiring to some people. We will also be reflecting on whether we can live by the values of Jesus in the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

## Science

This half term we will continue looking at different materials and their properties. We will focus on changes to materials; different ways they can change, and whether the changes are reversible or irreversible. We will also explore some changes can result in the formation of new materials.

## PHSCE

Our topic this half term is 'Relationships'. We will look at healthy and unhealthy relationships as well as different family arrangements.

## Art and Design

Our unit of work this half term is 'Every picture tells a story'. We will be thinking about the meanings and messages behind art by analysing and recreating the work of artists.

## Music

We will continue our ukulele sessions this half term. We will practise putting chords together to play songs and playing as a whole class in rounds.

## PE

As well as continuing with our swimming lessons, our PE unit for this half term is gymnastics. We will perform balances and rolls in canon, synchronised and mirrored.

## History

Our topic this half term is Ancient Greece. We will be focussing on how the Ancient Greeks have impacted our lives today by comparing and contrasting themes such as the Olympics, religion and art. We will be exploring the difference between democracy and monarchy, and reflecting on our government in comparison.

## French

In French we will be revising key vocabulary used for different food items. We will use conjunctions to extend our spoken and written sentences about food preferences.
